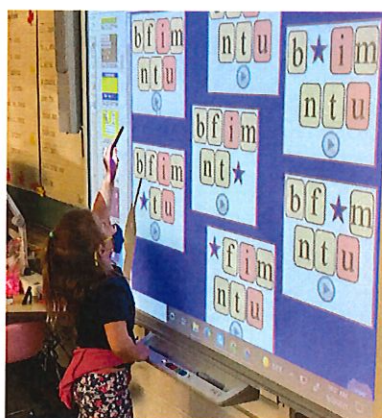
Let's Visit the Classrooms

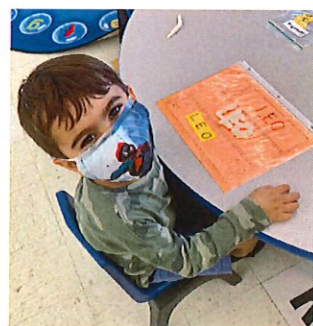

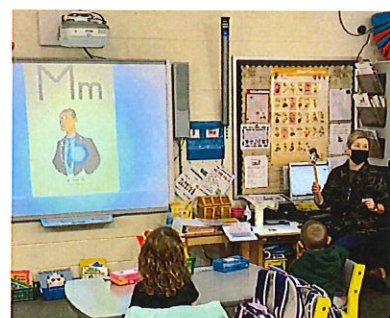
